

SEIU will spend over \$500,000 to try to take over our Hayward City Council. We need to stop them by voting NO on Measure ---.

They believe their big money will have more influence in a long, crowded, expensive November election than in June. Our local Hayward issues and candidates too often get lost in a barrage of money fueled ads, mailers, robocalls for November national/statewide races.

This presents individual local candidates with a daunting challenge to get their message out to the community when trying to compete with big special interest money. When Hayward voters have time to focus on Hayward elections, its more difficult for any special interest with overwhelming campaign cash to buy an election.

Help keep Hayward voters, not special interests, in charge of Hayward elections by keeping them in June.

Official campaign spending reports on file in the Hayward City Clerk's Office show SEIU's PAC spent over \$120,000 in 2014 to elect one of their hand picked candidates to our City Council. In addition, they spent over \$140,000 in 2015 to pay people to collect signatures to put Measure --- on the ballot.

Given their spending history, we believe they will spend, at least, another \$240,000 to pass Measure --- and elect 4 of their hand picked candidates to our City Council.

SEIU's goal is clear, move Hayward's election to November, where their enormous financial power can overwhelm any candidate not beholden to them. They want control over our community, and control by any special interest group over Hayward, is bad for Hayward!

Special interests cannot be allowed to dominate Hayward City elections whether they are corporations, political parties, developers, landlords, mobile home park owners, or SEIU.
